Current Scams Targeting Seniors

Tech support scams

How it works:

In this type of fraud, the scammer masquerades as a tech support representative from a company you trust like Apple or Microsoft. They'll claim that your computer or device is at risk of being infected by viruses and then trick you into granting them remote access or paying for software that you don't need.

Sometimes, the goal is to trick the victim into downloading what they think is helpful software. But when they do, it's actually malware that opens up the

helpful software. But when they do, it's actually malware that opens up the potential for cyber attacks that target the victim's banking information.

This scam often happens through phone calls, but it's also common to see popup ads on websites targeting seniors.

According to FBI's most recent report, tech support scams have cost seniors over \$200 million in losses.

Warning signs of tech support scams:

- You receive unsolicited phone calls about tech support. Companies like
 Apple will never proactively call you about these issues.
- A pop-up ad on a website claims that your device has viruses or promises to "speed up" your computer.
- The caller uses fear tactics to trick you into downloading software or clicking on links in emails.

The Night Ship

By Jess Kidd




