- 3. Add fraud alert and freeze your credit report.
- 4. Close any accounts that have been compromised or opened by thief.
- 5. File a Police Report
- 6. Change all affected account passwords
- 7. File a report with the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) at IdentityTheft.gov or 1-877-438-4338



The first feature film on Kwanzaa, The Black Candle traces the holiday's growth out of the Black Power Movement in the 1960s to its present-day reality as a global, pan-African holiday embraced by over 40 million celebrants.



Meet Isabelita

- B.S. Foreign Service, M.A. Political Science, Studied classical Piano and Voice at Eastman School of Music Community Education Division
- Isabelita was born and raised in the Philippines. In 1969, she took a one-year leave of absence from her job and with her two small children came to the U.S. to "pick up" her late husband, Ferdinand, who had just finished his Master of Law at Yale University in New Haven, CT. She had planned only to tour and experience the four seasons, but martial law was declared in her country and prevented their return. Ferdinand had been a law-student political activist, very vocal against Marcos' corruption, and was blacklisted.
- She raised her family in Rochester, NY, where Ferdinand was a legal writer and editor for Lawyers Cooperative Publishing Company, and later became a member of the NY Bar. In 2005, they moved to Shaker Heights to be near their son, who lives in Beachwood. She came to Normandy in 2022.

Work Experience in the Philippines: She worked at the Philippine Department of Foreign Affairs as assistant to the Undersecretary for Economic Affairs, Press Liaison Officer for the Secretary of Foreign Affairs concurrently Vice-President of the Philippines, secretary to the Undersecretary for Administration, and last as the political analyst for the North & South American Desk at the Office of Political Affairs.

Interests: the Fine Arts; travel (has toured 52 countries); evangelization; interior decorating; reading philosophy, history and religious/spiritual books; languages; Geopolitics

Best Accomplishments: My three fantastic children - Joaquin (a doctor at Metro Health), Rowena (HR Specialist in Charlotte, NC), and Rebecca (Attorney in NYC)

Biggest Disappointment: Not having been able to go home to grow old with her mother and to pursue her career in the Philippine Foreign Service. She had hoped to become a career ambassador of her country, like her contemporaries, some of whom she is still in touch with to keep abreast with the latest.

Goals: To turn every negative into a positive, to use her time more wisely, to <u>learn her faith more deeply</u>, and to <u>learn how to play the guitar</u>.
